Command and Control, Communication, Accountability are all keys to successfully mitigating an emergency event at your facility. Having a good emergency action plan in place and having all resources working in coordination toward the same goal is vital to success.

Emergency scene communications are often credited for the collapse of the incident command structure. Gulf Coast Emergency Response Academy

can train potential scene commanders in the proper communication techniques to implement at the scene of an emergency.

GCERA utilizes an accountability system during all training exercises. And it is an important building block within our incident Command training. Knowing "who" is "where" doing "what".
